Dear Friends in Christ,

We meet every Sunday at Willisburg Baptist-

Church for Sunday School, even though numbers are few. We are only running 10 - 20 in attendance these days, and worship service is running in the 20s to-40s on most Sundays.

I looked back at our attendance over the last five years and found that we are down 75% in Sunday School. Worship is down 43.3%. At the same time, our numbers financially have not been all that bad. Our undesignated receipts are down 5.7%. Cooperative Program giving is down 13.2%.

Association giving is up 58.2%.

Annie Armstrong giving is up 25.9%.

Lottie Moon giving is up 37.4%.

For the most part, finances are doing well, but we need involvement in worship and discipleship.

I am hearing things are starting to break again in the COVID numbers. I pray this is true. We must get people involved in fellowship, worship, and discipleship again. February 13th, I will be preparing a Lasagna meal at the church for all who would like to come and feast. I am asking those coming to let me know in advance. I want to have enough food prepared. So, far we have 18 people planning to attend.

Over the past few weeks, I have been preaching from the Old Testament Book of Nehemiah. This passage focuses on rebuilding. That is what we must do as the church. We need to start rebuilding now and rekindling our faith. We need a revived and renewed spirit within us. That all starts with us as individuals. I am praying for you. I trust you will pray for me. Together, let us begin a rebuilding process in our lives to become the church that God needs and wants us to be.

I would like to see more youth and children in our church. That means we must have activities for them and ministries that will involve them. I encourage your prayers for them. I will be praying for God to open these doors once again too.

At this time, I feel that God wants me to visit every single home in our Willisburg community and to pray with each family. People must know that we are a praying and caring church. I encourage you to do the same with your neighbors and friends.

As I close, my prayers are for your health and well-being. I also pray for your return and involvement in the church. God is not through with us yet. There is much work to do. We have a generation of people who are lost and need a Savior. God needs us to share our faith with others.
